A dedicated social reformer, Smt. Chandravijay Sumer Singh ji of Nawalgarh, was an enlightened educationist and an erudite visionary. She embodied perseverance, devotion, determination, and wisdom—a personality full of courage and enthusiasm. Her entire life was devoted to a noble cause: imparting quality education to girls, empowering them to become independent women of substance.

She didn't confine herself to a comfortable life but chose to work for the causes she cared about. Inspired by her father, General Maharaj Rajendra Singh ji, India's first Army Chief and Second Commander-in-Chief of India, she laid the foundation of Brightlands School for Girls in 1963 with 18 students, which now boasts of more than 2000 students. It stands as one of the best girls' schools in Rajasthan.

Being altruistic and eager to give back to society, she worked ardently for various social causes. As a conscientious responsible citizen, she diligently contributed to the earthquake-afflicted areas of Bhuj in 2001. She regularly visited Leprosy Homes, served as the Secretary of the Rajasthan Women's Cricket Association for nearly 10 years, and was the President of Jaipur Ladies Club. As the group leader of 'The Experiment in International Living,' she travelled to Europe and America. She was an active member of the Lion's Club-Jaipur and Indo German Society Jaipur, putting her head, heart, and soul into every task, big or small.

She wholeheartedly devoted herself to building and developing this institution, which serves as a spearhead for the citizens of tomorrow. It is a matter of great pride that the Brightlanders have consistently won competitions and proven their mettle in academics, co-curricular activities, and sports at the state, national, and international levels. Girls have brought glory to the school in numerous ways, aligning with the ethos and vision of the Founder Director. The school continues to grow ceaselessly, exploring new avenues to help girls reach new heights in education and become responsible citizens. Graduates are well-equipped with moral education and an optimistic approach towards life, entering fields such as civil service, design, academia, engineering, and medicine. Thus, the dream of Smt. C. Summersingh ji to empower the Girl child is being realized.
